FACTORS TO CONSIDER WHEN EVALUATING ALTERNATIVES

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will be evaluating reasonable alternatives to the Pebble project plan that could have lesser environmental impacts. This analysis will be completed in relation to the factors on the list below. During scoping, the Corps wants to learn which of these factors is of highest concern to you, along with information of specific concern regarding any factor listed. (In addition to these factors, the Corps is also asking for your input on reasonable and practicable alternatives, suggestions for resources that should be analyzed, and new data or analytic tools that should be used.)
